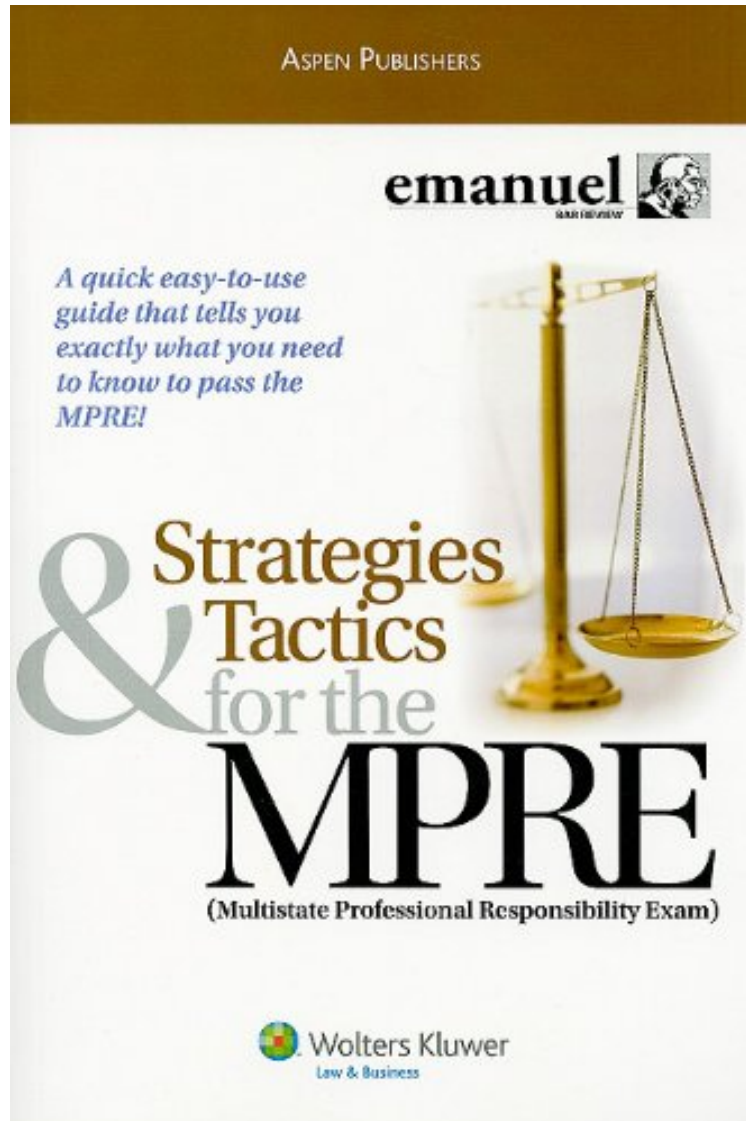

tackle multiple choice questions was, well, general and didn't have much added value. They had only a few questions with full answers - some of which were given as examples before, so I knew the answer to them already... Most of the questions were taken from the MPRE site, where they are offered for FREE with a notice that the law has recently changed and some questions + answers are following the old law. Nevertheless, the book used these questions with their answer key and didn't even provide full explanations to each answer. In general, I'm disappointed. I believe I could have done without this book... (Though Emanuel's book on the MBE is way better and recommended - Strategies Tactics for the MBE, 2010). I have passed the MPRE at first trial, but I had used another book as my main source of information. 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. Use in combination with Rigos MPRE Review By Dave Use this book along with the on-line BarOutlines.com, Rigos MPRE Review 2008-2009, and the official MPRE released questions from their web site and you'll do fine. The March 09 exam had NO multipart questions which was a shock - I and III but not IV, etc. This book gives you tactics and plenty of real questions (Rigos gives you more difficult questions). Having not had to take an ethics exam for the first two states years ago, I went overboard to make sure I passed. I kept doing questions, making my own outlines, and reading the code. Ended up with 120 when all I needed in TX was 85. I used this book to review and when I took the test, I found that it had prepared for me questions and questions types that simply did not appear on the test, and the visa-versa was true as well, it didn't include stuff that I would have liked to review.
