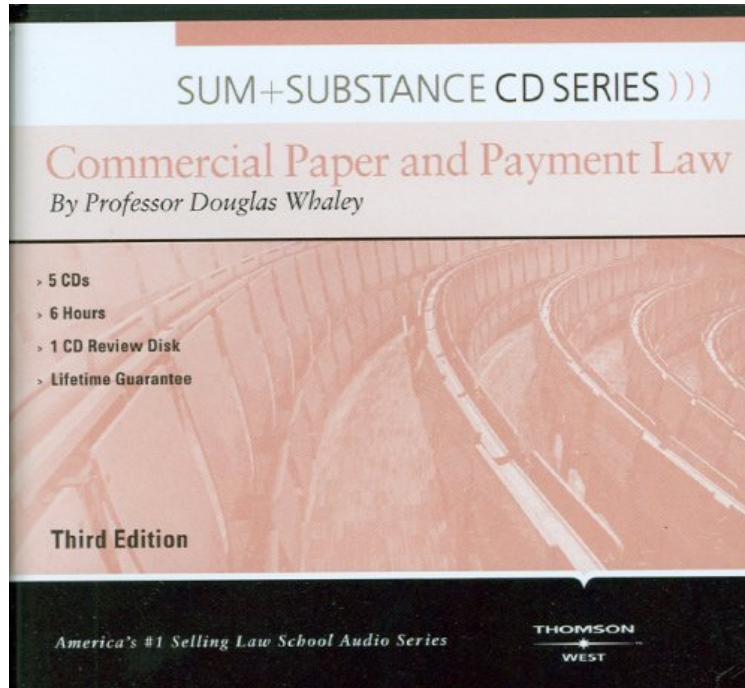

In addition, he gives you some important "tricks" of the trade should you ever encounter similar situations in your practice. I also have his Contract law CDs and am used to his style of speech. But for someone who is listening to Whaley for the first time, you might have to get use to his seemingly random approach to lecture topics (he goes off on interesting tangents) and his vocal intonation (which may seem annoying to some).
