I was horrified to count 4 separate references to shooting your spouse or someone else involved in your case. Is this truly a painless divorce?Although some of the strategies make sense, they were disjointed and very much oriented to an adversarial approach to the system. The bottom line in this book is "trust no one, and take no prisoners!" The writer was very obviously burned badly in her own divorce, and every single story in the book dealt with others who were similarly burned--yet the book offered no solutions whatsoever, besides revenge oriented tactics. Is it any wonder children of divorce suffer so? You know, not everything that happens in a divorce is someone else's fault. Having been there myself, and having been a divorce lawyer for more than a decade, I should know. The idea of being informed, being assertive, questioning a lawyer's advice when it doesn't pass the "smell test" are all good theories, but they're lost in a mire of horror stories and revenge motivations in this book.A better choice for legal procedures is James T. Friedman's "Divorce Handbook", and for the psychology end "What Every Woman Should Know About Divorce and Custody" (full of Machievallian tactis but pretty complete nonetheless). "Idiot's Guide to
