The 18th edition is now outdated (although it's just as useful as the newer editions for 95% of all legal purposes), and students in legal studies will be required to get the newest version. People in actual legal careers are likely to have one for reference purposes--but adjust the references in their documents according to local court preferences.This is not a book anyone gets for fun, or by choice. Either you need it, for a class or a career, and you get either the most updated version or you scrimp by getting an older one and hoping that choice won't come back to bite you--or you do not need it, and you don't bother getting it. If you need it, it's not like it matters if the book

is well-formatted (it is, mostly), well organized (sort of) or easy to understand (it's not); there are no alternative sources for this information.
