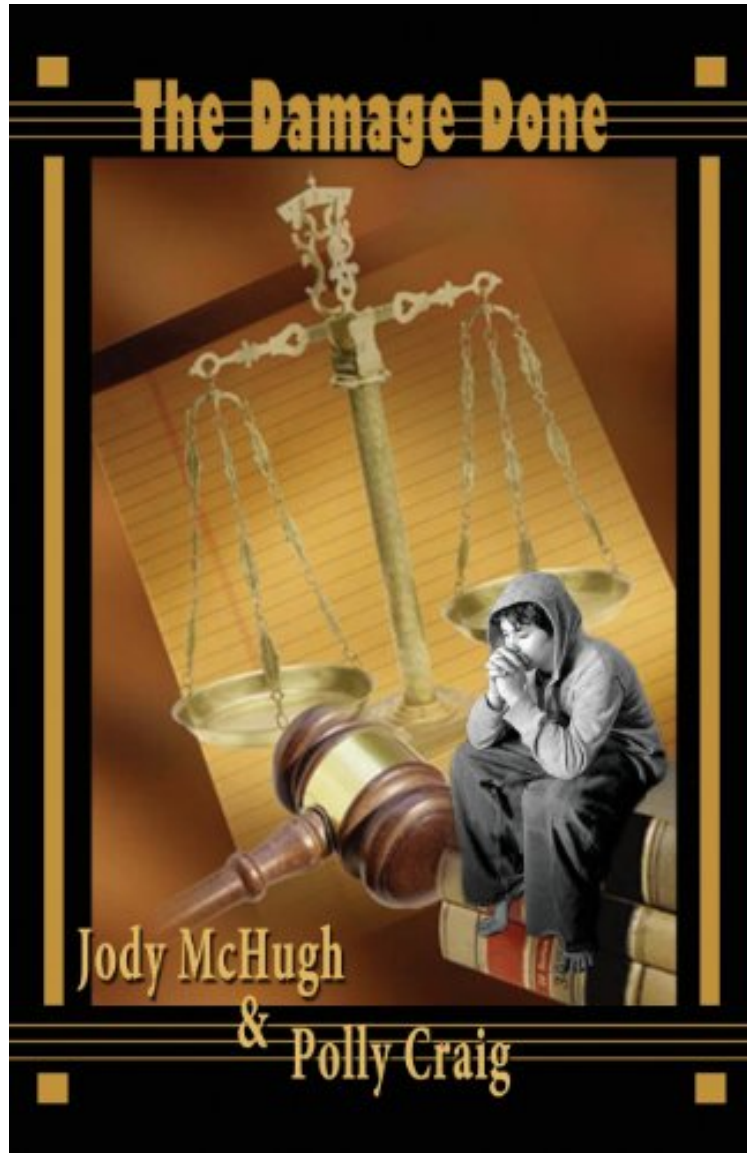

He did not allow me to read his book until my teen years simply because of all the information it exposes about his life. It shows the rights and wrongs of our court system concerning juveniles in today's society. This book tells the story of a boy influenced by family only for the worse (drugs, ect..)
