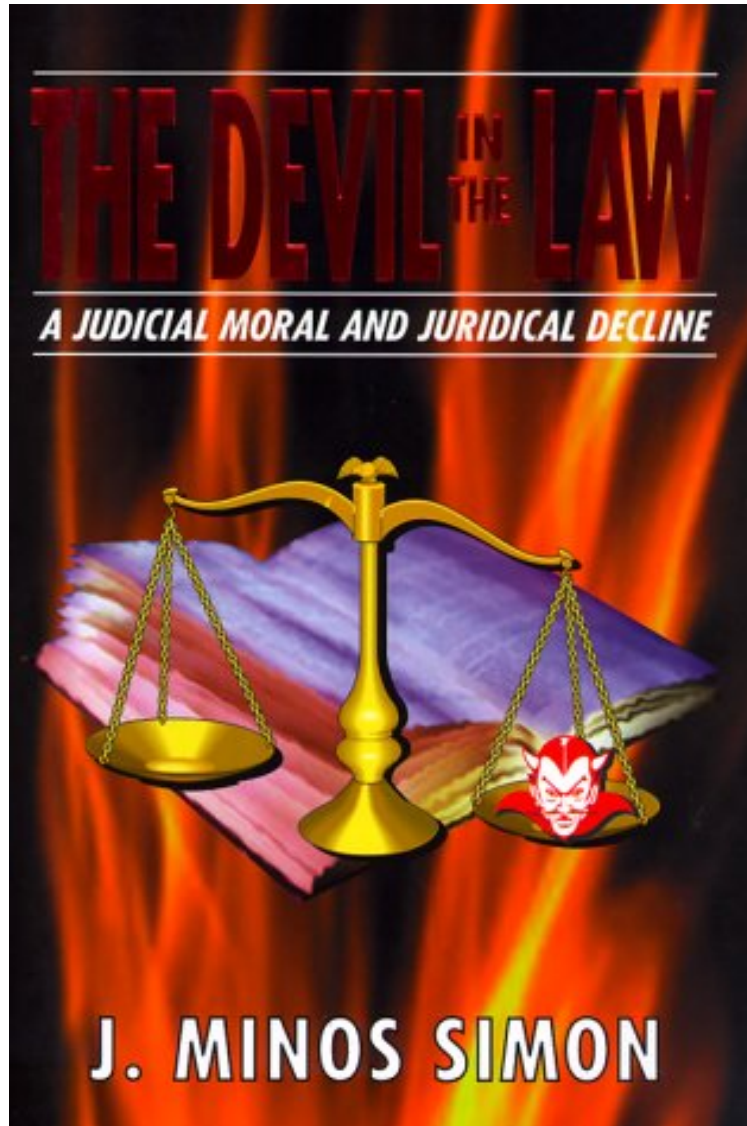

From his humble beginnings in the bayous of South Louisiana to the pinnacle of his career arguing before the United States Supreme Court, Simon developed a passionate love for the ideals for which America stands. A sportsman and a scholar, Simon is equally at ease quoting Rousseau in the court room or hunting alligators in the swamp. Over the years, J. Minos Simons legal talents have grown to near-mythic proportion. And this his second book demonstrates a talent as a writer which rivals his talents as a trial lawyer. He has functioned as a trial lawyer in both civil and criminal cases, and in both state and federal courts, and has tried thousands of cases. A recent computer search discloses that he has presented to higher courts for adjudication more than 547 reported cases, 446 of which were presented to the appellate and supreme courts of Louisiana, and 101 cases to the federal courts, 27 of which were presented to the United States Supreme Court.
