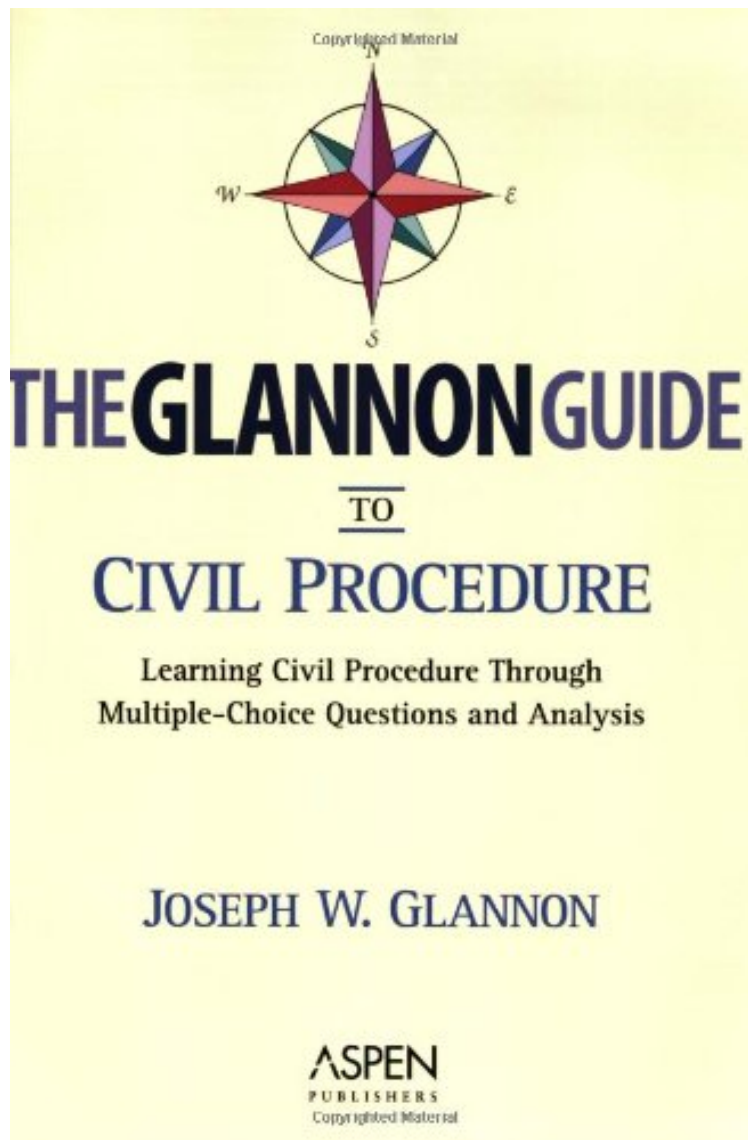

Easier read than the EE By A Customer I bought this book after I tried to learn from Glannon's Civ Pro Examples Explanations. This one is much simpler to read through because there aren't as many examples explanations getting in the way. Also in this book, Glannon works the multiple choice questions into the explanation and progression of each chapter. I liked this one because there were on average 7-8 multiple choice questions per chapter. Contrast that with the EE book which had twice as many questions. The EE book also laid out the lessons, then lumped all the questions at the end of every chapter with a separate answer section. I hated flipping back and forth. Overall this book has clearer explanations, is easier to learn from, and is slightly smaller than the Examples Explanations book.
