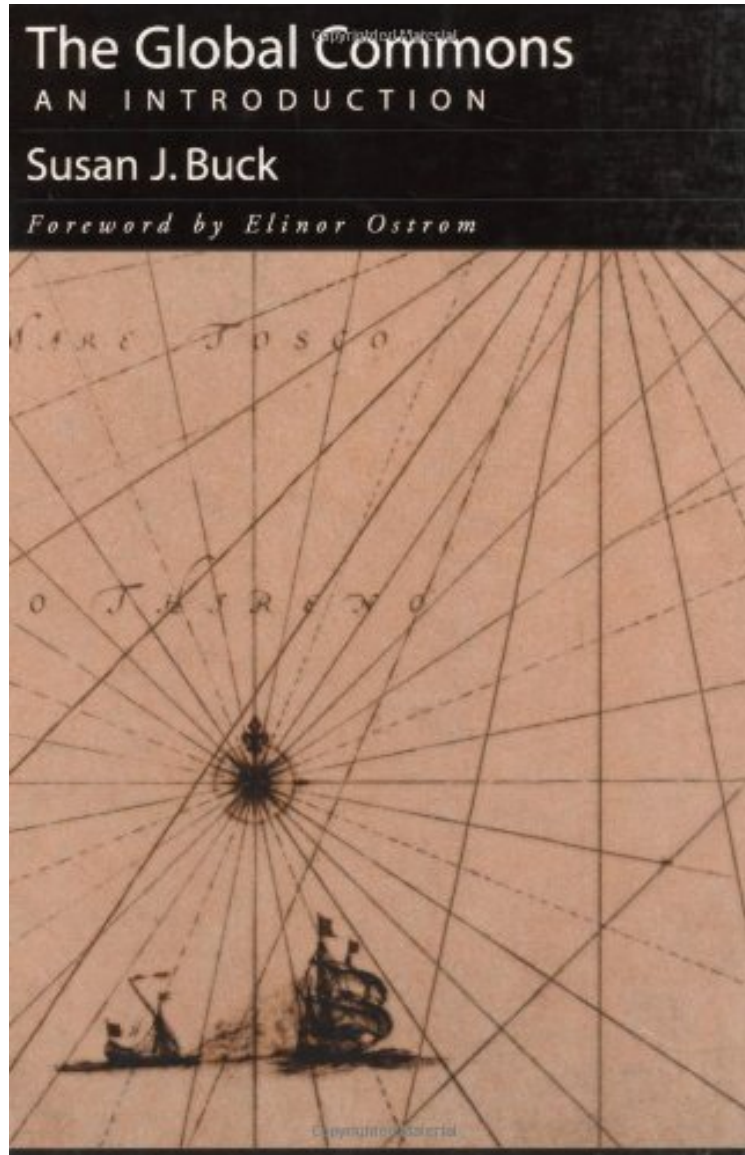

It also gives a good case study about Antarctica. very few geopolitical books that I have read has made such a deep analysis on such immediate issues. Not too intimidating for the reader who has little geopolitical know-how because of its explanation of current concepts and definitions (in the first chapter) as well as a glossary of key terms used.

In *The Global Commons*, Susan Buck considers the unique physical, legal, management, and policy problems associated with these areas.
