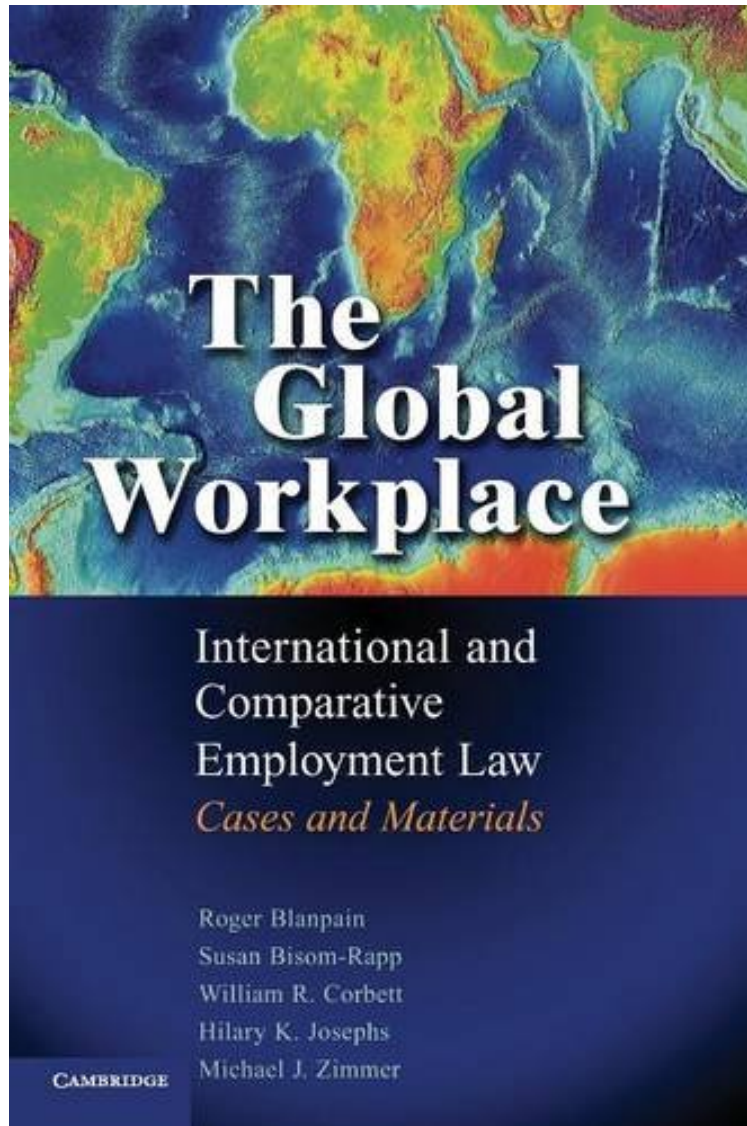

I was able to use a friend's hard copy to match up the locations for assignments so it wasn't the end of the world, but it was a little time-consuming. I made notes and put in bookmarks for the beginning and end of each assignment; the "Show Notes and Marks" option made it much easier to navigate the assignments. 3-star rating has nothing to do with the content of the text itself. With the forces of globalization as a backdrop, this pathbreaking casebook develops labor and employment law in the context of the national laws of nine countries important to the global economy -- U.S., Canada, Mexico, U.K., Germany, France, China, Japan and India.
