I'm a military spouse going through a military divorce and I bought this book for myself (the book is just as valuable to the service member). Like another reviewer said, it's a bit pricey, but when you consider how much time you're being charged by your attorney and how many thousands of dollars are at stake, it's well worth the money. When you're done with it, you can share this valuable book with any friends who may need it or you can donate it to a library (better yet, a library on a military base). If you're a non-lawyer, some parts may be a bit over your head as far as the legalese goes, but at least you'll know what issues about which you need to ask your attorney and make sure he is aware of. While this book does cite precedent (cases) from various states around the country, it is not a book that details individual state law. If you want a book on divorce law in general for whichever state in which you file, you'll have to find it elsewhere. However, this book will spell out your options regarding in which state you wish to file (military members have more options on choosing the state--the state in which one is stationed, where the spouse is living, home of record, etc.).
