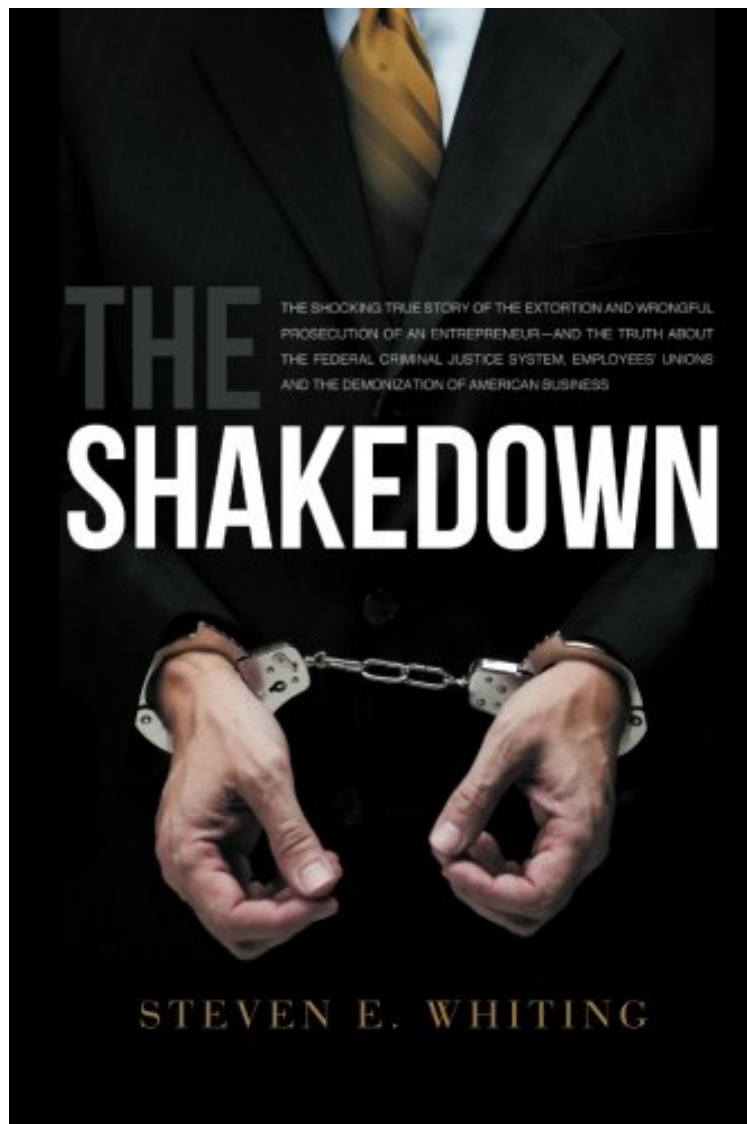

People wrongly convicted of rape and murder are not the only victims of unscrupulous prosecutors and judges who are their fond pals. The first half of this book tells the story of an entrepreneur, Steven Whiting, and how he ended up with felony convictions for white collar crime. The second half is what he learned--what he wished he knew at the start--and suggestions for readers who may one day find themselves targets of prosecutors who need a "win" to get a promotion or a raise. The business issues prosecutors misrepresented to the court in order to convict Whiting are complex which is why, I believe, Whiting repeats and tries to explain them several times. Due to my finance background and work with small business owners I understood the first time and found the repetition boring. For those who are unfamiliar with these particular issues, the repetition probably is needed. The bottom line is: Whiting was not guilty as charged but he went to prison. As I state on the website for my book, "Accidental Felon," this could happen to you. Whiting will help you be prepared.

In The Shakedown, Whiting eloquently recounts his ordeal at the hands of an unscrupulous federal prosecutor and shows in utterly convincing detail how his nightmare was just one instance of a stunning pattern of misconduct at the highest levels of power.
