The author wasn't "peddling" Trusts, in fact everyone should have one (you don't have to trust this author on that point), just giving us "stupid" people a better understanding of Trusts vs Probate. The first part of the book tells what happens when you don't have a Trust, which is Probate and how expensive and time consuming this process is for those you leave behind to deal with your "estate" - and it doesn't have to be a big one. That alone was helpful. The part about who to go to to draw up a Trust was helpful also along with great information for individual circumstances. As I was reading it I wrote down lots of questions to ask my lawyer and knew better than what sounded like good sound information from him.
