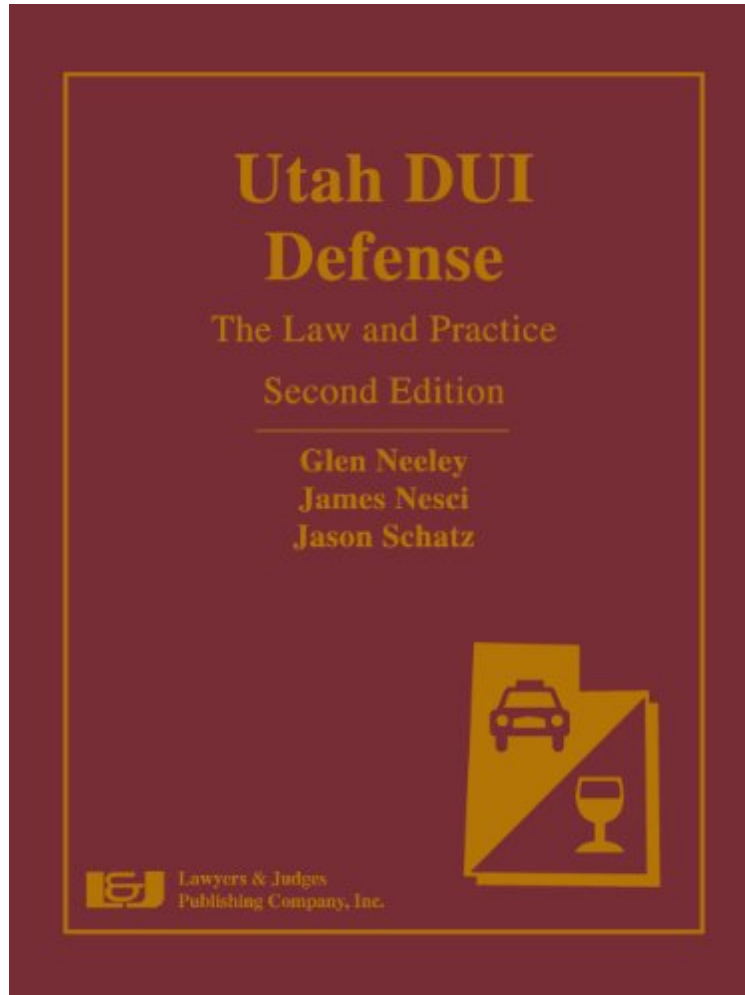

In 2009, Mr. Neeley passed all examinations and requirements for Board Certification from the National College for DUI Defense. In the Summer of 2009, he was officially Board Certified in DUI Defense, which was presented at the Harvard Law School, Cambridge, Massachusetts. He is currently one of only two Board Certified attorneys in the State of Utah. His practice is devoted entirely to criminal defense with an emphasis in defending those accused of DUI and drug-related offenses. His opinion is sought by DUI attorneys across the nation on various issues. He is one of only a handful of attorneys in the State of Utah who owns his own Intoxilyzer and his own Preliminary Breath Test (PBT) Device.
