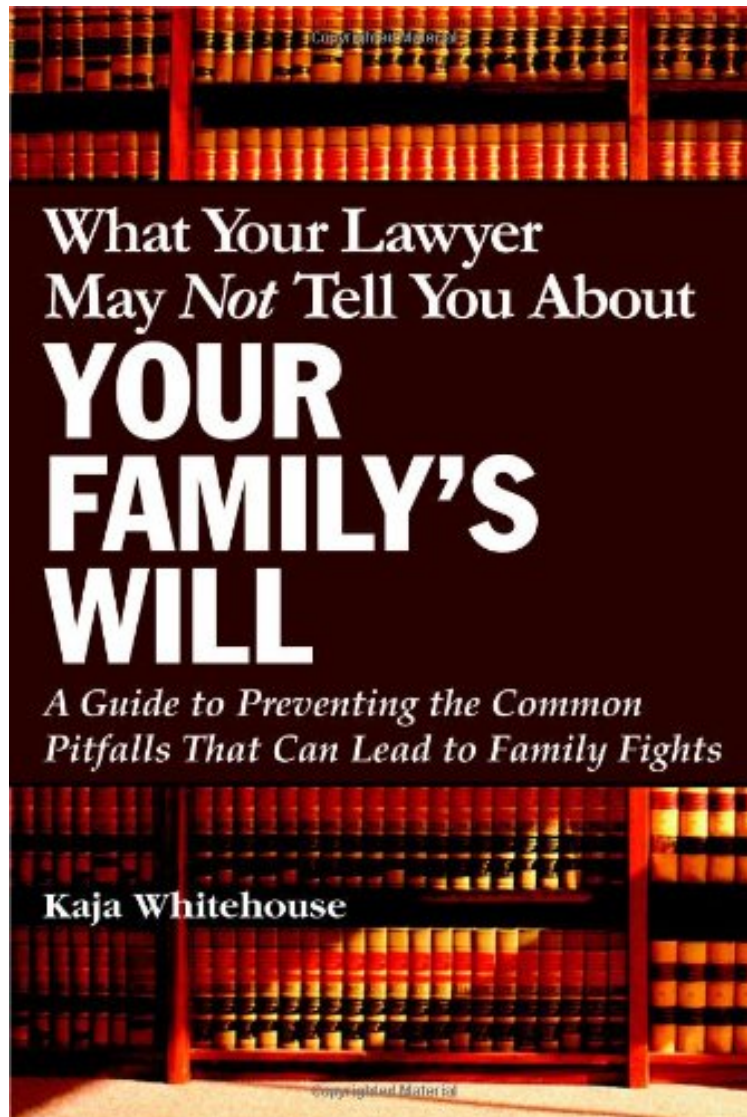

Mighty suspicious.I then googled the author's name and found a piece by the author on the NYPost about how she and her FAMILY are being harassed and intimidated by supporters of a company committing fraud that she exposed. And now, from her reporting, top executives from that company were arrested and charged. This author previously worked for the WSJ/Dow Jones. She's credible.I personally found the book easy to read, amusing, and helpful in navigating our will preparation. Too often you expect the lawyer to guide you blindly since they're the expert. Our lawyer was surprised that we were knowledgeable at all since it was our first attempt at a will. Being a new parent, the most imp't thing I learned was that in appointing a guardian for my son, not to appoint a couple, to appoint the one person from that couple that you want responsible, b/c in the event that couple divorces or is otherwise dissolved, this ensures the person you want responsible will have custody. For example, appointing your brother and not your brother AND your sister-in-law as guardian if you want your brother to have custody in case anything happened to the couple. Rather than having to google and read numerous sources with questionable credentials, this book outlined it all.
