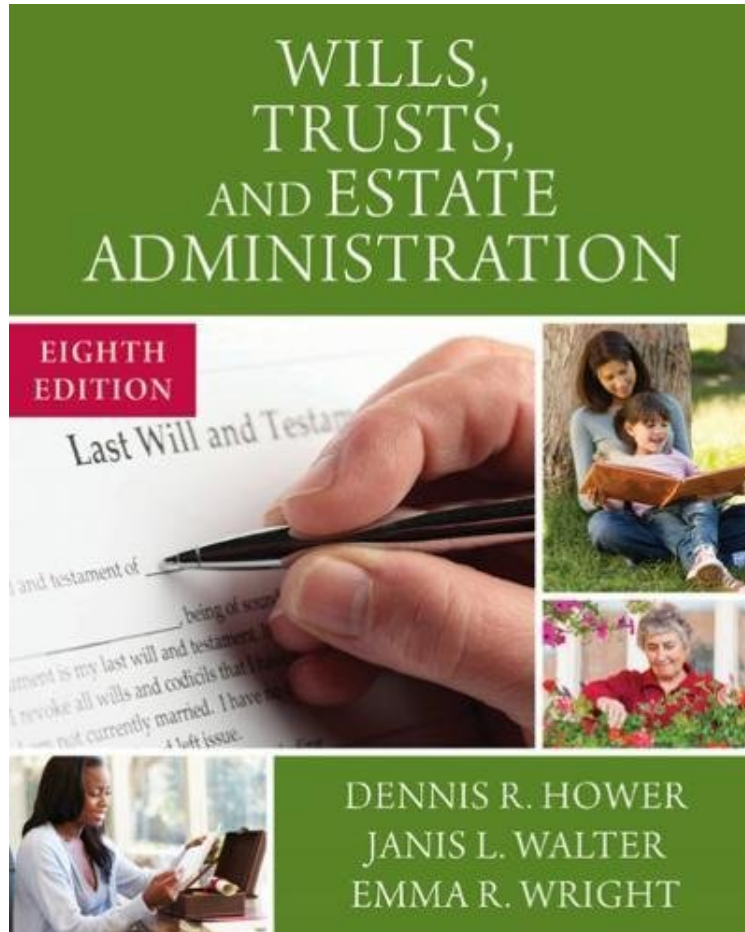

Morse Amoco Foundation Award for outstanding contributions to undergraduate education.
