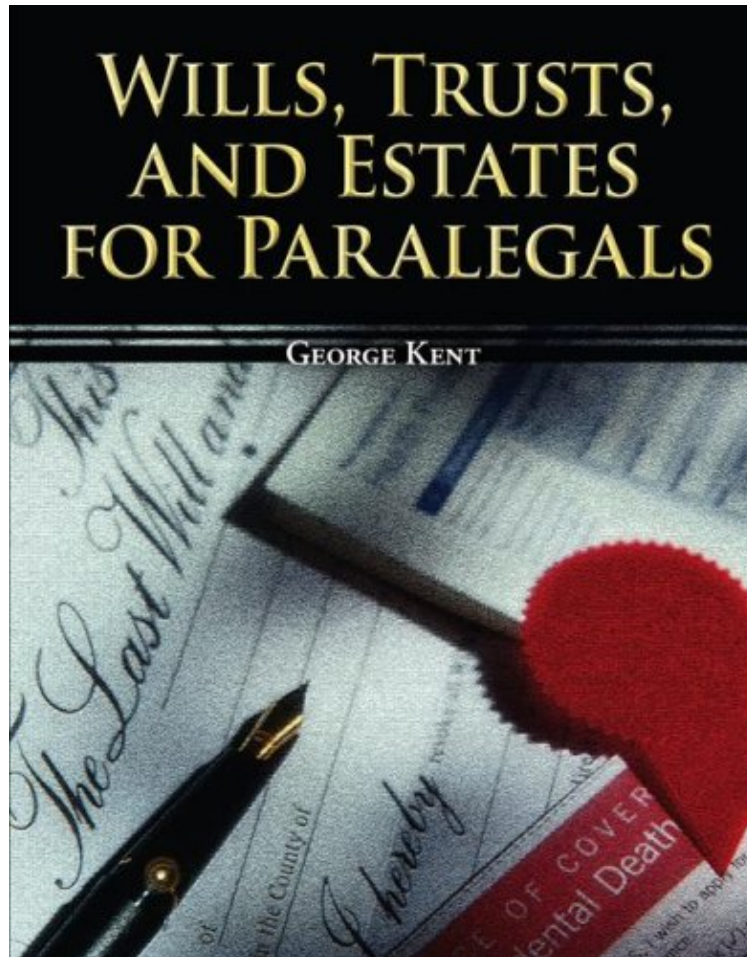

For the majority of the class our professor had to use a different book to supplement what we should know about estates and probate. It's a bare basics book that does not go into a lot of detail to different scenarios or broader definitions for certain terms.The only positive comments I can say about this book is that it has good case studies in it which helps you better understand the concepts in the book and it also has some good examples of a sample trust and will if you wanted to draft your own. Aside from that you're only getting bones in terms of actual knowledge. If you

see this book early as part of the class talk to your professor immediately and request that you use a different text. I personally think this was not worth the 40 bucks I paid for it. Sometimes when a term is defined, there will be a term inside of that definition that won't be defined until a few lines later. And when I say defining terms, I mean on the side margin. The text itself is brief and covers the basics. I recommend this as a supplemental reading. Our professor spends most of his time explaining the terms and points in class anyways. There's a lot of additional material in the summary area if you have the time to look at it. I thought the crossword puzzle was cool.
